# **REQUESTS FROM THE ORGANIZERS**

In order to help make Firefly a place where everyone feels comfortable learning, growing and connecting, please consider how your actions may affect others.

#### PLEASE BE CONSIDERATE OF:

- The Land: We are gathering on the ancestral lands of the Aniyvwiya or An-igiduwagi (Cherokee) people. We acknowledge that these people were violently removed from their land against their will; that countless treaties were broken and that we gather on stolen land. We offer our condolences for the suffering that has been endured by both the original people and the land itself, in being separated from its beloved human tenders. These truths compel us to make relations with the Indigenous peoples who have persisted through colonisation and who are still with us today, including the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians and the Catawba Nation, and to invite them into this gathering as our honored guests. We commit to working together to find the path of healing for all beings. We invite you to do so also; and to ask permission of the land to be here, and offer gratitude for the grace provided. Always leave everywhere more beautiful than it was when you arrived. Connect, listen and consider your impact.
- **Diversity:** Firefly Gathering participants come from a variety of backgrounds, perspectives, cultures, belief systems, etc; this is part of what makes our event so unique and impactful. We must all therefore practice tolerance of other people's opinions and points of view, especially when they differ from our own. Remember, there is strength in diversity.
- Personal boundaries: Violence or harassment of any sort will not be tolerated. Always ask for consent, and respect any and all expressions of boundaries.
- **Non-smokers, especially children:** If you smoke, please do so only at the designated smoking areas indicated on the map.
- **Pack it in, pack it out:** Everything you brought, even as it's transformed into recycling, compost or garbage, must leave with you. This is an opportunity to expand your awareness of what and how we consume Earth's gifts.
- No-Dog Policy: Service animals with service tags have a legal right to be here. They must be on leash at all times, and their humans must pick up after them. Failure to do so will result in us requiring that the dog be removed from the event.
- **Fire Policy:** Fires are allowed only in fire locations marked on the map or in well-established fire rings. All burning fires must be attended at all times and must have a fire extinguisher and/or bucket of water on hand at all times.

#### REQUESTS FROM THE ORGANIZERS CONTINUED

- Camping locations: There is abundant space in the three camping fields and the woods. Please do not set up camp around the lakes, in class fields, or on ferns.
- Families: Show each child kindness, and model good behavior. Be discreet with language and smoking. Other than family or guardians, no adult should be alone with any child, unless the child is clearly lost or hurt and in need of assistance.
- **Alcohol:** We ask that alcohol consumption be at your own camp or discreet in common areas. We ask that consumption be maintained at levels that do not inhibit responsible decision making in a community setting. Disorderly conduct will not be tolerated.

# **CAMPER INFO**

#### **MORNING CIRCLE - 9:30 AM EACH MORNING!**

We will set our intentions and partake in a bit of ceremony together each day at morning circle. The ritual of coming together, sharing songs and stories and moments of connection are an integral part to being in community. Morning circle sets the tone of the day. It's here that we also announce class changes and other relevant information. Please come and stand shoulder to shoulder with us!

#### SIGNING UP FOR CLASSES

You can find your class on the kiosk boards at **Firefly Central**. There are 2 class sessions each day (except Sunday, which is morning only).

- If there is a blank line with a number next to it for the class you want to take, add your name to attend the class.
- If there are no spaces left, the class is full.
- Please cross your name off the list if you decide to take a different class so someone else can enjoy your place.
- Some classes are multi-session and some even multi-day, and some have material fees. Read class descriptions carefully for details.
- Please be considerate by not signing up for multiple classes during the same session.

Class schedules for the following day will be posted by 7pm at Firefly Central. You can get an idea of what classes are being offered by looking at the printout, but please note that classes are subject to change. Check the **Changes & Cancellations** board at Firefly Central for the most up-to-date class offerings. Be sure to attend **Morning Circle**, where any last-minute changes will be announced for each day's schedule.

#### **CAMPER INFO CONTINUED**

#### **SWIMMING**

Swimming is **AT YOUR OWN RISK**. There are no lifeguards on duty. Parents and guardians are charged with the safety of your youth. A bathing suit or other clothing is required for the upper pond but optional for the lower pond.

#### RIDE-SHARE

There is a **Ride-Share Board** at Firefly Central for you to get home in style! Please consider reducing fossil-fuel use and pooling resources by posting your availability if you have space in your vehicle.

#### FIRST AID

The First Aid Tent is located below the pavilion, next to the lower pond. There are trained first-aid staff, available including herbalists, nurses and EMTs. They are available and glad to help with preventative maintenance and care, small accidents and emergencies. They will be staffing the tent during daylight hours and until around I Ipm at night. For after-hour emergencies, look for the "after-hours" walkie-talkie with instructions at the First Aid Tent.

Thank you for bringing your children to The Firefly Gathering and entrusting us with their care and well-being. It is our heart's work to inspire your kids' innate wonder and love for the natural world. We strive to nurture and engage your children in safe and loving ways. We have programs for kids of all ages, and all kids classes will meet in the **Youth Village** (see map).

## **FOOD & KITCHENS**

In addition to amazing food vendors, we provide two kitchens for anyone to use – the **Primitive Kitchen** with a fire for cooking during mealtimes and a **Community Kitchen** with propane stovetops and a sink. You are welcome to use your own camp stoves as well. Sharing and thanksgiving are welcomed and encouraged. We do not provide waste disposal or refrigeration. Nearby convenience stores have ice for your cooler if you need it. Please note, **open fires are only permitted at fire rings designated on the map**.

Folks often wonder why some get fed at Firefly and others don't? While we would love to feed everyone, we simply do not have the infrastructure to support that dream. So, we settle on feeding those folks who are working hard throughout the event to help make it all happen. This includes: staff, worktraders, instructors, performers, etc.
